## What is Red Squirrels United?

Red Squirrels United is the biggest ever national coalition of organisations working together on red squirrel conservation across the UK. All this is made possible thanks to funding from [EU LIFE14](#) and the [Heritage Lottery Fund](#). There are 2.5 million grey squirrels in the UK compared to just 140,000 red squirrels. We are working together to monitor and prevent the further spread of grey squirrels into the red squirrel strongholds. In addition, we are delivering lots of community events that raise awareness of red squirrels. Of course, our conservation work is underpinned by rigorous social and scientific research and we are collaborating and sharing best practise. It's very exciting times!
